A mark made on a surface (printing tile) with a pencil or other tool.	A pattern is a design in which lines, shapes, forms or colours are repeated.	This is when you use more than one colour in your design. Making sure it goes exactly on top of the original design.	When you carve your design into printing tile. Once you've made a printing block, you can print with it over and over again.	A white, lightweight plastic used for many different things.	This is used to ensure that the acrylic paint is applied evenly to the printing tile.	The final design is carved into a polystyrene tile (usually square or rectangular).
						

LS Lowry (1887 – 1976)



Lowry began painting and drawing as a child. When he moved to Pendlebury in 1909, he became captivated by the industrial skylines of billowing chimneys, factories and mills which appear in many of his paintings.

Lowry worked as a rent collector. He would walk around the city and witness other people going about their day. He loved people-watching and created many of his paintings from the landscapes, buildings and people he saw.



Take a BLUNT pencil and make marks in the foam. The marks must be quite deep, so you must apply quite a bit of pressure, or go over your lines several times.

Take off the paper to reveal your print.



Roll out acrylic paint evenly on the roller



Place the painted polystyrene tile down over paper, and using a clean, dry roller apply even pressure.
