### **Design and Technology days**

We started our half term with two design and technology days. The purpose of the two days was for the children to use their creativity and imagination as well as their mathematical, scientific, computing and art knowledge to design and make products. Each class started with a 'Big Question' for example Nursery and Reception – Can I make a healthy snack? Year 1 – Can I make a moving toy vehicle? Year 4 – Can I make a hand warmer? Year 6 – Can I create a Greek banquet? Children then looked at existing products/solutions and evaluated them, looking for the good and bad points. Children then used this information to design their own product, considering carefully how it will be made and why. Children then made their products and tested if they worked as they had planned, considering what went well and what they might have changed. It was a great first two days to the half term!
