








Art & Design: How have the Tudors shaped our lives today?

This term, we are looking at Willem Claesz. He is known for his still life paintings. We have learned skills linked to painting, sculptures and drawing so far.

Willem's still life painting looked natural with the fabric in the background and the cutlery, goblets, glasses and food. He used silver grey, golden yellows and browns mainly. Willem Claesz created 3D effect in his painting by painting the objects in front in bright colours and keeping the back and base in tones of black and white.
