
Artist

Designer

Children will design and make their own hand warmers as part of design and technology. They will learn and improve their sewing skills and learn about materials that can and can't be used for hand warmers

Reader

We will be reading a range of texts this term including fiction and non-fiction. In Everybody Reads we will be reading The Witches, whilst our class novels will be Pugs Of The Frozen North and The Boy Who Grew Dragons.

Scientist

Animals, Including Humans: we will investigate the digestive system and how we digest food. We will also look at food chains.

States of Matter: The children will learn about solids, liquids and gases.

Children will enhance their writing skills and build up to writing adventure stories, newspaper reports, portal stories, non-chronological reports. We will concentrate on developing settings within narratives, using appropriate language and structures within our writing.

Historian



Children will learn about the local history of Bolton and how it has changed throughout the years of the industrial revolution. This will include learning about the cotton mills, famous people from Bolton and local area.

Geographer.

Children will learn about the physical geography linked to the cotton trade and why the cotton mills came to Bolton. Children will also try out mapping local area amenities. They will learn different compass and map skills and how it helps in locating places and giving directions.
