Dear Parent/Carer,

MEET THE TEACHER

This is a brief, informal meeting where you can meet the class teacher and they can share important messages about the year ahead. If coming into school and you are able to, we ask parents/carers to wear a face covering. We ask only one parent/carer to attend. We will send the MSTeams link out next week. If this is not a convenient time, please do not worry. We can share the presentation with all parents/carers via email and/or arrange an alternative mutally convenient time.

On PE days children should come into school wearing their Heathfield PE kits. (This is not a non uniform day). **Year 1 and Year 6 will start PE next week**, the other classes will start PE week beginning 13th September.

SEPTEMBER 2021 and COVID 19

As you will know, Step 4 marked a new phase in the government's response to the pandemic, moving away from stringent restrictions on everyone's day-to-day lives, towards advising people







on how to protect themselves and others, alongside targeted interventions to reduce risk. As COVID-19 becomes a virus that we learn to live with, there is now an imperative to reduce the disruption to children's education. The priority now is to deliver face-to-face, high-quality education to all pupils. The evidence is clear that being out of education causes significant harm to educational attainment, life chances, mental and physical health.

The key changes are:

- Children will no longer remain in class bubbles
- There will no longer be a staggered start and end to the day
- Face to face assemblies can now resume
- Adults can work across different classes to best support our children
- Children can enjoy playing with friends from other year groups at break and lunch times
- Adults that are double vaccinated and children under the age of 18 years old will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case.
- School is no longer responsible for track and trace. Parents will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace if their child has been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test
- As a school, we will write to parents/carers should we have a positive case in school so that you are fully informed and warned

Should cases start to increase across school, it may become necessary to reintroduce 'bubbles' for a temporary period, to reduce mixing between groups. Any decision to recommend the reintroduction of 'bubbles' would not be taken lightly.

Of course the above changes are very much welcomed but the virus has not gone away and so we will still have some control measures and procedures in place to restrict the spread of the virus.

- 1. Ensure good hygiene for everyone.
- 2. Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes.
- 3. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.
- 4. Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19.

We will continue to use the external one way system around the school site so children can sanitise/wash hands as they enter the building.

In school we will continue to have additional cleaning throughout the day from our site team.

If a child develops symptoms, they must not come to school and get tested.

If a child develops symptoms at school, parents/carers will be contacted and asked to arrange a PCR test.






